Points North and East for December 2016 and January 2017 by Jim Ogg

Mid Winter Snow opportunities continue in December especially for Yosemite and Eastern Sierra. The Sealth image El Capitan Birthmarks (SR136) shows the giant monolith that is Tu-tok-a-nu'-la (El Capitan) has marks that are worthy of its cataclysmic birth

One-to-four weeks after a drenching rainfall, look for Fungi. The Bull Elephant Seals continue to contend for control of the beaches near Piedras Blancas. Mid December brings the breeding females and the start of the birthing of pups. And continue to look for low tide opportunities and/or "winter" coastal wildflowers.

The air temperature determines the opportunities for Monarch Butterfly images. The Pismo Beach Monarch web page (www.classiccalifornia.com) indicates that Monarchs cannot fly at temperatures less than 55, and at a temperature lower than 40 degrees, it is unable to move at all. At these temperatures, the Butterflies form dense clusters on the pine trees and alien Eucalyptus trees. Besides the Pismo Beach Preserve, wintering Monarchs can be found at Sweet Springs Marsh Preserve, Montana de Oro State Park, in the eucalyptus windrow next to Ramona Rd. in Los Osos, and north of Sebastiani's Store at San Simeon. Also Morro Bay State Park has several butterfly overwintering sites. Check the campground and the Eucalyptus windrows in the nearby golf course.

Sometimes the Carrizo Plains National Monument is a spectacular photography opportunity during the wetter winters especially Painted Rock, Soda Lake, Plains animals and wildflowers. Painted Rock is only accessible by humans in the winter before March 1. The petroglyphs of Painted Rock are colorful, predominately red, black, and white. Often late in February, wildflowers can be found on the trail to and at Painted Rock. Soda Lake is usually a salt flat but wet winters bring a most dramatic lake when full and supports one-fourth of the California's wintering sandhill crane population. On the plains, look for Pronghorn Antelope, Tule Elk, and Kit Fox families. Late Winter early Spring sometimes brings foreground to horizon carpets of wildflowers.

For me January is an in between month. Elephant Seals, Butterflies, Dunes and Fungi are the stars. By January the Central coast usually has had a drenching rainfall, so some fungi may be found at the East-West Ranch (Fiscalini Ranch Preserve) in late December or early January. It is useful to know the seasonal cycles. The Elephant Seal pup birthing peaks mid January. And in January and early February, the Butterflies mate and the females leave soon after.

Fungi are the precursor of spring. They pop up before the new grass can overwhelm them. 2005 was a great year for Fungi. The Club had an outing to Cambria Cemetery that was successful in finding many Fungi including Bolettes, Fly Alaric, Chanterelles, Jack-in-the-Box, and Turkey Tail. One of these is poisonous, one is a insect killer and a hallucinogenic and two are prized edibles. One is \$10.00 per pound at the local grocery store. Fungi can also be found at East-West Ranch South-East corner particularly; San Simeon State Park, San Simeon Point, Stadium Park and Jim Green Trail in Atascadero; Los Osos Oaks Preserve, Eagle Rock Loop trail in El Chorro Park and Ferrini Ranch Open Space near SLO. The problem with Fungi is that they are very dependent on the rainfall. The Fungi seem to need a drenching rainfall; then appear one-to-four weeks after. In winter 2005-2006 we had a series of drenching rainfalls so the great Fungi year.

January is also the best to explore the local secluded beaches. If it is not raining the beaches have comparable temperatures to summer with more sunlight and better sun lighting angles. Some "winter" wildflowers should be starting to bloom in the Beach Dunes, Sea Bluffs and some Coastal Scrub plant zones. Montana De Oro SP, San Simeon Point, Elfin Forest Loop Trail, Estero Bluffs SB, Pismo Dunes Preserve, and Oso Flaco Dunes are places to look for "winter" coastal wildflowers.

For the next several months, Yosemite may provide the opportunity for winter snow images in the Valley. However since the Valley is only 4000 feet it usually only gets snow a couple of times a year. And because of winter driving conditions it is best to be in the Valley before it happens. Finding snow high up on the walls of the Valley is more likely. In February, 2007, the club timed it perfectly for Yosemite Valley in winter.
