Points North and East For December 2014 by Jim Ogg

Mid Winter Snow opportunities continue especially for Yosemite and Eastern Sierra. Mammoth Mountain Ski Area opened Nov. 13. And one-to-four weeks after a drenching rainfall, look for Fungi. The Bull Elephant Seals continue to contend for control of the beaches near Piedras Blancas. Mid December brings the breeding females and the start of the birthing of pups. And continue to look for low tide opportunities and/or "winter" coastal wild-flowers. The image "Beach Grafitti (SR203)" shows some spectacular archaeological ruins and colorful decorations that may be found on the beaches of Santa Barbara County, California.

The air temperature determines the opportunities for Monarch Butterfly images. The Pismo Beach Monarch web page (www.classiccalifornia.com) indicates that Monarchs cannot fly at temperatures less than 55, and at a temperature lower than 40 degrees, it is unable to move at all. At these temperatures, the Butterflies form dense clusters on the pine trees and alien Eucalyptus trees. Besides the Pismo Beach Preserve, wintering Monarchs can be found at Sweet Springs Marsh Preserve, Montana de Oro State Park, in the eucalyptus windrow next to Ramona Rd. in Los Osos, and north of Sebastiani's Store at San Simeon. Also Morro Bay State Park has several butterfly overwintering sites. Check the campground and the Eucalyptus windrows in the nearby golf course.

Sometimes the Carrizo Plains National Monument is a spectacular photography opportunity during the wetter winters especially Painted Rock, Soda Lake, Plains animals and wildflowers. Painted Rock is only accessible by humans in the winter before March 1. The petroglyphs of Painted Rock are colorful, predominately red, black, and white. Often late in February, wildflowers can be found on the trail to and at Painted Rock. Soda Lake is usually a salt flat but wet winters bring a most dramatic lake when full and supports one-fourth of the California's wintering sandhill crane population. On the plains, look for Pronghorn Antelope, Tule Elk, and Kit Fox families. Late Winter early Spring sometimes brings foreground to horizon carpets of wildflowers.

Beach Grafitti (SR203)

The boundary between Central California cultural influence and that of Southern California is not precisely defined. However a partially destroyed structure on the beach west of Santa Barbara appears to reflect the cultural differences. The Southern California grafitti contrasts with the Central California beautiful outdoor art form.

The "Beach Grafitti" image is part of the Sealth body of work which are digital images of landscapes, scenics, and the human form and are based on locations in the Santa Barbara, Goleta, Central Coast of California and High Sierra.

IMAGERY OF CUBA ... March program Meeting on Wednesday, March 4, 2014

There are a few photographers nationwide who have figured out a way to work with the complex treasury rules (Why on earth are they in that department?) that regulate travel to Cuba. A number of local members have made the trip with a photographer out of Ventura. I (Dave Clary) have signed up to travel with another such trip leader, Charles Anselmo. He is based in the Bay Area and has lead 28 organized photo trips to Cuba. Howard Ignatius and Peggy Janssen from the SLO club have gone on trips to Cuba with him and have raved about them. Howard did the presentation to our club on Night Photography and Peggy on her great grandfather who was a leading general under Czar Nicholas in Russia.

Charles has a 6-page resume of shows he has participated in and routinely does presentations on Cuba and other topics. So I asked if he would be willing to do such a presentation to our club. He readily agreed. His presentation will be largely based on printed photos about Cuba. For anyone interested in this culture of contradictions (communism, dictator-ship, equality, poverty, great music, great sports teams, high health standards, high literacy and educational attainment [not so common in Latin America], a mobile museum of 50s cars, friendly people, and wonderful imagery), this should be a great program. It should be an eye opener even if a trip to Cuba is not on your bucket list. Isn't that part of what we do? Expand our horizons?

We will be working on some mini programs for the second half of our program meetings in order to provide variety and keep y'all interested. So stay tuned.
