SMCC Field Trips March 2015 and Beyond

March 7th (Sat 8 am) First Saturday Chat Group - Meet at 8 am @ Francisco's Country Kitchen on North Broadway and Williams Street in Santa Maria, which is next to the Best Western Motel.

Why go? - Enjoy photo talk over breakfast and coffee.



March 21 (Sat 8:30a-late afternoon) Harmony Headlands Hike and Town Walk -

Carpool from Santa Maria or Arroyo Grande (see below) to meet by 10:00 am at Harmony Headlands State Park trailhead parking lot, about 5 minutes N out of Cayucos on the West side of Hwy 1. Besides your camera, bring water and trail snacks, sunscreen, hat, etc. Wearing layers is a good idea. The trail, an old ranch road, starts along Villa Creek and goes 1.5 miles out to see the ocean from an overlook and that's our turn around spot. However, 1 mile in from the parking is an old bunkhouse and restroom that could be enough hiking for some.



After the hike, or instead of the hike, we can explore the town of Harmony before finding something to eat. *Your trip leader is Alan Upshaw*, home phone **543-6798**/cell **748-5171**.

To get to the trail head by 10:00 am, carpoolers can meet at:

- 1. 8:30 am behind Francisco's Country Kitchen (see above Chat), or..
- 2. 8:55 am by Carl's Jr/Kmart in Arroyo Grande (Oak Park and US 101)

Why go? - Springtime can bring impressive blooms of owl's clover, poppies, goldfields, lupine, buttercups and SLO morning glory, if we time it right!

Points North and East For March 2015 by Jim Ogg

By late February, Shell Creek was showing some color, mostly fields of Baby Blue Eyes and Goldfields were found. Also there were Fiddleneck, Mustard, Poppies and others. And the Almond Blossoms were right on schedule.

March is usually the prime month for Central Coast wildflowers. The Beach Dunes, Sea Bluffs and some Coastal Scrub plant zone's wildflowers will continue to happen and usually peak in March. Also the Chaparral, Oak Grassland, Oak Woodland, and Streamside Woodland wildflowers should peak. Lopez Lake Rec. Area, Santa Margarita Lake Rec. Area, Montana De Oro SP, and Lake San Antonio Rec. Area are locations to checkout. Carrizo Plain wildflowers may also be peaking.

Usually March is the start of the San Joaquin Valley wildflowers. Fresno's Blossom Trail usually peaks the first or second weekend. Also the Sierra foothills north, east and southeast of Fresno often have extensive wildflower displays. The wildflowers at Hite Cove, west of El Portal, are often spectacular during late March and early April.

March is usually the month for waterfalls and wildflowers along the Big Sur coastline and wildflowers in the Big Sur eastern valleys especially Carmel Valley Road and San Antonio Mission. The Sealth image SR141 shows McWay Falls. It is the classic Big Sur venue; but its beach is inaccessible. Also Pinnacles National Monument often has wildflowers but with a short season and access to some trails ends March 1.

Watch for Vernal Pools during March and April. Obviously these are very dependent on the rainfall amounts and pattern. With its heavy rainfall in January and February, 2008 was a great year for vernal pools. Laguna Lake Open Space may have Vernal Pools. Also look for Vernal Pools in San Simeon SP and Carrizo Plain. In the Sierra western foothills, McKenzie Big Table Mountain Preserve NE of Fresno usually has Vernal Pools. And look for them in the eastern San Joaquin Valley.

The California Lilac is not really a Lilac but a Ceanothus! However with their spectacular blue-purple haze color, almost tree size, and chaparral dominance, they are worthy of being called the California "Lilac". They are actually about a half dozen species of Ceanothus. They bloom in March - April and can found on the Cuesta Grade, along Hwy 41 between Atascadero and Morro Bay, north of Piedras Blancas, along Big Sur and at Point Lobos. In 2004-2005 the California Lilacs dominated the recovery succession after the Hwy 41 fire making a forest of bluish purple. Look at recent forest fire areas for a repeat.
