Meet at the Pacific Dunes Ranch RV Resort (1205 Silver Spur Place, Oceano 93445), parking in the dirt lot as you enter the place, and try to keep a low profile... We'll walk up through the RV park to enter the dunes.

We'll be walking in loose sand most of the time. Tripods are nice. If there is any wind blowing, you'll want to practice good camera/lens hygiene to keep the sand out of your equipment.

Sunset is at 4:55 pm. There will be plenty of time to explore the dunes and pick a spot for the golden hour.

After shooting, those who would like to eat out can pick a place nearby, such as Efren's Mexican Restaurant in Oceano.

Points North and East For November 2018 by Jim Ogg

I provide a different perspective on photographic opportunities. I live about an hour north of Santa Maria in Atascadero so I have a North SLO county perspective. Well I did from November through March. From April through October I was lucky to be able to spend much of my time at my cabin in Mammoth Lakes. Hence the North and East perspective. This was a Never Summer - Never Winter life style. My springtime was from February through August. Fall was from September through December. I believed that I got the best of the Central Coast and the Eastern Sierra - the "left coast" and the "right mountains."

Long Valley Caldera is one of the largest calderas in the World. It is several hundred square miles in area and includes the town of Mammoth Lakes. In the heart of the Long Valley Caldera, at the Hot Creek Geological Site, the geyser hints at the earth shattering forces below. The Sealth image, "Hot Creek Geyser (SR111)," shows a very active site in the Caldera.

Yosemite Valley Black Oaks could still be promising for early November. The Central Coast vineyards are turning and Central Coast Fall Color usually starts late in the month of October. I will be checking out Huasna, Adelaida, and the vineyards west and east of Paso Robles; western side of Salinas Valley in Monterey County, and the Edna Valley.

Many of our beaches and dunes of the Central Coast are only accessible by humans during the period from October 1st to March 1st. The best opportunity for shooting on these beaches and dunes is early in the winter season; fewer footprints, more animal tracks and some undisturbed sand ripples can still be found. The three miles of the Sand (Dunes) Spit of Montana De Oro State Park is especially productive and the Pismo Dunes Preserve and Oso Flaco Dunes should be checked out.

November is the start of daytime low tide access to the local beaches. Usually low tide occurs between noon and sunset and is often very low (minus) tides. This has the benefit that the tidal pools, coves and beaches are most accessible with fewest visitors. If it is not raining the beaches have comparable temperatures to summer with more sunlight and better sun lighting angles. Some early "winter" wildflowers may starting blooming in the Beach Dunes, Sea Bluffs and Coastal Scrub plant zones. Montana De Oro State Park, San Simeon Point, Elfin Forest Loop Trail, East-West Ranch Bluff Trail, Estero Bluffs State Beach, Morro Bay State Park, Pismo Dunes Preserve, Oceano Dunes and Oso Flaco Dunes are places to look for low tide opportunities and/or "winter" coastal wildflowers.

Usually the first opportunity for the drenching rainfall Fungi seem to need, is November. The Fungi then appear 1 - 4 weeks afterward. In 2005-06 we had a series of drenching rainfalls hence a great Fungi year. That year's Club trip to Cambria Cemetery succeeded in finding many Fungi including Bolettes, Fly Alaric, Chanterelles, Jack-in-the-Box, and Turkey Tail. Fungi can also be found at East-West Ranch, particularly the

Southeast corner; San Simeon State Park; San Simeon Point; Stadium Park and Jim Green Trail in Atascadero; Los Osos Oaks Preserve, Eagle Rock Loop trail in El Chorro Park and Ferrini Ranch Open Space near SLO.

The Butterflies and Elephant Seals return to the Central Coast in November. The non-breeding Elephant Seals haul out at Piedras Blancas early in November. The Bull Elephant Seals start arriving mid November. Soon after their arrival they contend for control of the beaches with often bloody fights.

Board Meeting Minutes

A Board meeting of the Santa Maria Camera Club was held at Merrill Gardens on January 24, 2018. Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m.

- 1. Attendees: Richard Russ, Dave Clary, Sharon Salerno, Alan Upshaw, Bill Hood, Flavio Parigi, Nyla James, Bob Ginn and Rosie Brancacio. Ramona Cashmore arrived at 7:02 p.m. and Penni Powell arrived at 7:09 p.m. We have a quorum.
- 2. **Approval of Minutes -** The Board read the 'draft' minutes from the meeting held on September 27, 2017. Changes to the minutes none. Alan motioned to approve the minutes, Dave seconded the motion, and the minutes were approved by the Board.
- 3. Treasurer's Report: \$2864.84. 34 paid members
- 4. Reports on Special Committees: Christmas Potluck
 - a. Bill confirmed the Christmas Potluck was booked for December 12th. Chuck's raffle brought in \$130 for the club.
 - b. Richard recommended a 'Chairman' for the Special Event Committee for the BBQ, the Fair, the Christmas Potluck and the Awards Banquet. The Special Event Committee is composed of the six At Large Board Members. Penni suggested the At Large Board Members stay after the meeting to discuss who will be doing which events.

5. Unfinished/Old Business

- a. End of the Year Book vs. End of Year Project
 - i. Discussion by Bob Ginn, members can submit one or all three books
 - a. Three different books that can be submitted
 - b. Contemporary pictures taken 2018
 - c. Favorite photos Taken anytime

- a. Single Subject/Theme
- b. Board consensus was to have the Book as the 'Year-end Project'

6. New Business

- a. SMCC Welcome Letter and Club Application
 - i. Rosie requested to review the Welcome Letter and Application for the club.
 - a. Discussion on the 'Welcome Letter' was the months listed in which the Club does not hold a 'Program' meeting. The Board discussed and agreed to add January to the months listed.
 - b. Discussion on the 'Application' was the verbiage regarding dues for children. The Board discussed and agreed to leave the application as is.

b. SMCC Projector

- i. Richard brought up for discussion the topic of buying a new projector. The Club has been using Dave's projector for about six months. Discussion results:
 - a. Dave and Alan to do the research and get back to the Board
 - b. \$1000 spending limit
- c. Jeanne will be the Digital Projectionist and Greg is the back-up when Jeanne can't make it.
- d. Two Categories for 2019
 - a. Richard proposed to have only 2 Categories next year; Digital and Large Prints
 - i. Discontinue Slides. Reason: Everyone other than Dalton can submit prints and Dalton can bring in his slides to the 'Program' meeting and the Club can still see his slides.
 - ii. Discontinue Small Print. Reason: Not very many club members submitting small prints. Counts 2014-100 /2015-no count /2016-82 / 2017-62. Five people entered small print 7 times or more in 2017. Small print can still be submitted on a 16x20.
 - iii. Discontinue B&W prints. Reason: B&W wins in digital and we don't separate Color and B&W in digital.
 - b. In theory, all prints will be Large Prints and everything can go under that category, small prints, B&W and color prints.
 - c. Richard suggested for the Board to think about the pros and cons and discuss at the next Board meeting.
 - i. Penni wanted to know what the count would be if all in one and what about going to points; unknown.
 - ii. Ramona said the snack breaking time would be lopsided since we will more than likely have a lot more prints than digital.
 - iii. Flavio commented on the fact that if slides are shown only at the program meeting, then there is no learning from the Judge's comments.
 - d. The Board will decide if it goes to vote and then if it does go to vote, the Board will decide if the members would be the ones to vote.
- e. Naming convention for the digital submissions Nyla initiated discussion

- a. Club no longer uses the 'old' naming convention and that results in that digital photos are not shown in the order the member would like them shown.
- b. Blurb on the website needs to be re-written
- c. Rosie to send change in wording to be approved so that email can be sent to members
- b. Approval for photos to be posted on the SMCC website Nyla initiated discussion
 - a. Does anyone look to see if the checkbox for permission to post the photo to the website is checked before posting
 - b. No current mechanism to ensure this is being done
 - c. Would this present issues if someone's photo ended up on the website and then did not want their photo on the website
 - d. No resolution to the question
- c. Extra photos submitted
 - a. Jim McKinniss inadvertently submitted four images at the last Competition meeting, Nyla suggested he only submit two at the next Competition meeting and Richard proposed that to Jim and he was fine with that recommendation
- d. Meeting adjourned at 8:54 p.m.

7. Announcements

- a. Rosie to send out reminder to members to pay dues
- b. Richard to announce the 'Book' as the year-end project at the next SMCC meeting
- c. Ramona to put something in the Galleon regarding the 'Book' being the year-end project and that more information to follow
- d. Rosie to send out an email to members on new naming convention for digital submissions

The last Competition Meeting for this year is November 28th (not the 21st as previously planned).

Besides this being our Competition night, we also need to take care of other business.

We need to collect all winning images for this year in preparation for our annual Awards Banquet in January, and, if you participated in this year's photo project, we need to collect your photo book to be judged and displayed at our annual Christmas Potluck.
