Joyce Wilson's career is legendary. Her studio in Indianapolis, IN served as the base for portrait and commercial assignments from London to California. She is an award-winning photographer/artist, educator of the visual arts and presented lectures and workshops throughout the world. In 1996 Joyce moved to Santa Barbara, CA, and served for 16 years on the faculty of Brooks Institute.

Her images have appeared in numerous advertising campaigns for Fuji Film, Polaroid, the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra, and covers for various photographic publications. She was presented the International Photographic Council Leadership Award at the United Nations in 2003, and Professional Photographers Lifetime Achievement Award in 2006. Her fine art images are in the permanent collections of several museums including the University of Michigan, the Crocker Museum in Sacramento, Albrecht-Kemper Museum of Art in St. Joseph, MO, and the Santa Barbara Museum of Art.

Joyce's earlier art training in evening classes at John Herron Art Institute informed her work, and she has been able to straddle the world of commercial photography and fine art. She shares her wealth of knowledge teaching creative workshops, mentoring teenagers through the Santa Barbara Arts Fund program, and is active in the Santa Barbara Art community.





11-15 (Sun) – Travel to Las Vegas. If time, visit 7 Magic Mountains art installation nearby before dark off I-15 at Jean NV.

Camping: Red Rock Campground (no hook ups). Lodging: Red Rock Resort, W Las Vegas

11-15 (Mon) – Red Rock Canyon (West of LV)

With the necessary pass in hand (must reserve in advance), take the scenic drive (13-mile one way loop) in the morning. Either repeat the loop in the pm or drive up nearby Mt Charleston.

Camping: Red Rock Campground (no hook ups). Lodging: Red Rock Resort, W Las Vegas

11-16 (Tues) – Valley of Fire Nevada State Park (NE of LV)

It is about a 75-mile drive to the West entrance of Valley of Fire SP. Secure a campsite then explore the park.

Camping: Atlatl Rock Campground (hook ups, showers). Lodging: North Shore Inn, Overton outside of the park

11-17 (Wed) – All day at Valley of Fire SP, possible moonlight photo shoot. Same camping and lodging options.

11-18 (Thurs) – Boulder City (SE of LV)

Exit Valley of Fire by the East entrance and drive South to Lake Mead (Redstone Dunes, White Owl slot canyon) and Boulder City in the pm (Hemenway Park bighorn sheep, Hoover Dam, and the Southern Nevada Train Museum/ Tour on the Rail Explorers).

Camping: Boulder Beach, Lake Mead. Lodging: Hoover Dam Lodge or other nearby

11-19 (Fri) – Nelson NV "Ghost Town" (S of Boulder City 30 miles)

Am Railroad Tunnel hike from the Hoover Dam Lodge then drive to Nelson NV for the rest of the day. Mine tour at 2pm, photo ops galore! Full moon photo shoot tonight.

Camping: Boulder Beach, Lake Mead. Lodging: Hoover Dam Lodge or other nearby
