The End-of-the-Year Photo Competition by President Dave Clary

Contrary to what you may have read the end-of-the-year photo competition is alive and well. For many years we did have a benefactor member who donated cash prizes. He decided not to do that, and there is no requirement that anyone donate funds like that forever. It was his decision and we respect that.

As a result at the March 28, 2015 board meeting, a motion was made, seconded and passed that the club would not longer have monetary awards for the end-of-the-year special competition. The reason is that this would by and large be a club expense. If a PSA representative wishes to offer PSA Memberships that certainly would be welcome.

We don't have cash awards for any of our regular monthly competitions, and I think and hope that the challenge of this project, and having a lot more flexibility in preparing for the competition than in previous years will be equal to or more than the incentive to enter a photo in a monthly competition. For new members, the subject is "Timepiece." The photo prints are basically the same as the large back categories, to be mounted on a 16×20 inch back, one entry per photographer.

The winners are traditionally announced, and all the entries displayed at the annual Christmas Potluck. Our thoughtful treasurer, Bill Hood, set the date for the Potluck for Wednesday, December 7, 2016. He set it early this year to make sure the space was reserved. Once again it will be at the community center of Casas Grandes Estates here in Santa Maria.

We usually have members turn in their photos in November in time for us to organize the judging and prepare labels for the display, etc. The last meeting of the year is the competition on Wednesday, November 16, 2016. So that will be the date for turning in the photos. This gives us plenty of time to prepare for the display at the Christmas potluck. We have September, October and most of November remaining to prepare for this new end-of-the-year competition. I think we are likely to see a lot of imaginative, thoughtful images and I am looking forward to it. As we get closer more details will be provided.

Points North and East For October 2016 by Jim Ogg

Fall Color continues to be the big attraction in October in the Eastern Sierra! The high country, 7,000 to 10,500 feet elevation, Aspens and Cottonwoods Fall color may still be near their peak early in October. Check for Fall Color at Virginia Creek, Virginia Lakes, Conway Summit, Bishop Creek, Laurel Meadows, Hilton Creek, Lee Vining Creek, Summers Meadows, and South Bishop Creek Waterfall.

The Fall Color areas in the 4,000 - 7,500 feet elevation range usually peak in early to mid October. Included in the 7,500 foot range are Convict Lake Loop Trail, McGee Creek, June & Gull Lakes, Reversed Peak Tarns, Grant Lake, Lundy Canyon, Tuffs Campground, Buckeye Creek, Masonic, Leavitt Meadows, and Parker Lake. At lower elevations and usually a week or two later, look for Fall Color in the Buttermilks, Bishop area, and Alabama Hills. In the lower elevations, Cottonwoods are the predominate Fall Color.

Fall Color usually comes to the Western Sierras mid to late October. Yosemite has Aspens at higher elevations but they are not as consistent, prolific or as accessible as the Aspens of the Eastern Sierra. However the Western Sierra has Black Oaks in 4,000 foot range, its Yellow Pine Belt. Black Oaks have the best fall color of the Oaks family. The most well known grove of Black Oaks is near the entrance to Yosemite Valley. It has El Capitan as a backdrop; some backdrop! Also Black Oaks can be found at Oak Creek in Owens Valley. Yosemite Valley also has some "alien" trees that are spectacular in Fall Color; look near the church for one. Also the Generals Highway Loop in Sequoia & Kings National Parks is worth checking out for Fall Color.

"First Snow" usually happens in October. I find my best snow images in First Snow and "Last Snow" rather that "Mid Winter Snow". First Snow and to a

lesser degree Last Snow contours the mountains accentuating their features and naturally flocks the trees and shrubs. And this month those trees may still have Fall Color! I look for First Snow opportunities in the Mammoth Lakes Basin, Heart Lake in Little Lakes Valley, Convict Lake Loop Trail, Bishop Creek and McGee Canyon. The best time is first sunlight after the snow storm. Achieving this is often a serious access challenge.

Bodie in First Snow is visually dramatic. A fresh covering of snow blasts sunlight into the sides of the Bodie structures like a giant reflector. Once i crosscountry skied the streets of Bodie racing the Park Ranger's snow plow.

Also i hope to photograph the Bristlecone Pines in First Snow or Last Snow. Also First Snow usually closes Tioga Pass. However the Yosemite Park management will sometimes reopen it. Several years ago they kept it open until New Years Day but usually appear to prefer to keep it closed. I plan for Tioga Pass to be open or reopened until the end of October and closed permanently at the first major snow after the beginning of November. The Sealth image "Great Sierra Lode (SR245)" shows the abandoned mining area along the Sierra Crest north of Tioga Pass.

October 1 or when the Snowy Plover chicks fledge, human access to many of our Central Coast beaches and dunes resumes. Immediately after opening is the best time for shooting; no footprints, lots of animal tracks and undisturbed sand ripples. The three miles of the Sand (Dunes) Spit of Montana De Oro SP is especially productive.

Great Sierra Lode (SR245)

Located along the Sierra Crest, the Great Sierra Mine was to be the next Comstock lode. To extract the silver and gold, the precursor of the Tioga Pass road was done; a tunnel over 1000 feet deep was drilled in solid granite at 9850 feet; and six loads of up to 4200 pounds of equipment each were hauled nine miles, up 4000 feet, over an 11,300 foot pass, for two months in the middle of winter at a cost of one life. No significant silver or gold were ever recovered! Where could the silver and gold veins be and could only the view over the Yosemite high country justify this monumental effort?

The "Great Sierra Lode" image is part of the Sealth body of work which are digital images of landscapes, scenics, and the human form and are based on locations in the Tioga Pass, Yosemite National Park, High Sierra, Eastern Sierra and Central Coast of California.



October's Competition Judge

This month we have a new judge with quite a photographic background. His name is Dennis Fisher and he is a 1975 Brooks graduate with over 45 years of experience as a still photographer, photojournalist, cinematographer, range instrumentation optics engineer, and electro-optics consultant. Dennis began his career serving in the Marine Corps as a combat photographer, afterwards working for Pratt and Whitney Aircraft in their high-speed instrumentation photographic department. He attended Brooks Institute to complete his college education in scientific and technical photography before going to work in management and engineering for the Western Test Range at VAFB where he oversaw the fixed and mobile optical tracking systems. He was instrumental in transitioning the Range from film to digital imaging systems. After retiring from VAFB, he established Genesis Applied Imaging, Inc., an optics consulting business that focuses on electro-optical systems and their application.

Dennis has worked as a technical consultant on Apollo 13 and Top Gun and as a cinematographer on Firebirds. Most recently, he worked for Red Bull on their Stratos Space Jump project where he was tasked with designing a system capable of photographing a man from 25 miles away and tracking him during supersonic free-fall.
