Hey fellow adventurers in photography,

I just got back from Japan. Lots of beautiful sights, interesting food, and friendly people!

I loved the ryokan (Japanese Inn) experience, scuba diving, and sunsets. I had three wonderful women dress me up in a kimono and other wonderful people help us when we got stuck in transit turnstiles and other times when we were obviously beyond our ability with too much baggage trying to navigate stairs.

I got lucky to go diving with the only English-speaking dive guide in Kushimoto, Hirotaka Koike, and two Japanese women who did not speak English, Kaori, and Tomo. We photographed many colorful fish as well as lobsters.

As we were chatting after the dive (with Hirotaka interpreting), I found out the lobster was a dead one Kaori had brought to take pictures of. I cracked up and thought she had fit right in with our camera club.

I have been getting into underwater photography using my little GoPro camera since April. It is a blast. I can finally document which fish I saw and look them up to identify them. I may not have any award-winning photos, but I do have reminders of what I saw. That is me looking into my camera while we are diving.



Above water, I find myself shooting more and more with my iPhone. I have taken tons of photos with it and found it frustrating not to be able to view them side-by-side in Lightroom with the photos I took with my Olympus camera.

Well, I just discovered a way to do it (after doing a few online searches). It involves downloading Lightroom (mobile) onto your smartphone, importing images from your camera rolling into Lightroom (mobile), then synchronizing Lightroom (mobile) with your desktop version of Lightroom, which in my case is Lightroom Classic. The phone photos remain in your camera roll (unless you delete them) and they reside in Lightroom on your desktop, ready to be viewed with your other wonderful photos. I would like to know if anyone else in our club does this.



Bio: Christopher Broughton received both his bachelor's and master's degrees in photography from Brooks Institute of Photography, Santa Barbara, CA. Christopher has been involved in photographic education since 1996. He served as a full-time professor of photography at Brooks Institute of Photography in Santa Barbara teaching in both the undergraduate and graduate programs for over 22 years. He currently teaches photography at Mount Saint Mary's University in Los Angeles, Antelope Valley College, and Ventura College. Teaching has had some wonderful opportunities. In 1996 Christopher taught for the University of Pittsburgh and their Semester of Sea program where he spent 100 days traveling to 10 different countries around the world on a ship. For the past 10 years he has had the opportunity to instruct his students in Paris and London during the summer. In addition to teaching, for the past 5 years he has been part of the commercial photography studio team at Deckers Outdoors Corporation (HOKA, UGG, TEVA, AHNU) providing e-commerce images across the corporation's distinct brands. 
